SHAPING THE FUTURE Helping La Porte County Skill UP

There are more jobs than people to fill them, in some local industries. That's why Unity has supported efforts to keep and grow good jobs, especially in the manufacturing and the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering/Environment and Math) fields.

Unity is proud to be one of the La Porte County Skill UP Network partners. The Skill UP Network was awarded \$677,000 recently from the Dept. of Workforce Development for a 3 year effort, spearheaded by the mayors from Michigan City and La Porte and coordinated by the Center of Workforce Innovation. The focus is to create an integrated talent supply system to support La Porte County manufacturers in filling skill gaps in high demand, high skilled jobs. It's estimated that throughout the state, 30,000 jobs annually will require an industry specific certification in addition to a high school diploma. We want to help make sure those jobs in La Porte County are filled by residents of La Porte County. The Skill UP grant provides funding to bring together local employers, educators, economic development partners, and non-profits to offer programs and opportunities for our communities to grow and develop. We are excited to be at this table with so many passionate individuals and groups working toward the goal of a more highly skilled local workforce.

Unity was proud to be a partner with Economic Development Corporation of Michigan City and Michigan City Area Schools for the second annual Week of Code. In May, all students spent time learning about coding. Bringing coding tools, like Ozobots, into the classrooms helped add the necessary element of fun into learning. Through a caring Unity donor, most classrooms throughout La Porte County have access to tiny robots that can be programmed by students through computer programs, templates, and a marker system that allows the students to draw the path an Ozobot must take. Codes to make their tiny friends jump, turn around, or switch directions help students learn how to plan ahead and troubleshoot.

If you aren't familiar with this technology, we encourage you to visit one of our grantees, La Porte County Library, to see their makerspace and the many great opportunities offered to our community there!

We believe in the future of La Porte County, and we think the workforce has untapped potential. Through initiatives like the Skill UP grant and Week of Code, we hope to see an increasingly skilled workforce and La Porte County residents obtaining secure, high wage jobs.

Unity's Home Team has Audience with Lt. Governor Crouch

Since 2004, Unity has convened stakeholders around the topic of housing and homelessness in our community. In June, representatives from our Home Team met with Lt. Governor Suzanne Crouch to share progress and highlight the goals of our Plan to End Homelessness. State Representative Jim Pressel and former State Representative Tom Dermody coordinated the meeting to show how La Porte County agencies are working together to address homelessness.

The Lt. Governor oversees the Indiana Housing & Community Development Authority, so she serves as an integral alliance with Home Team. La Porte County has seen an increase of homelessness, despite an overall decrease throughout the state of Indiana, which highlights the importance of the Home Team's work and presence in our community.

As Crouch noted in her social media post, the Home Team is focused and taking action. Ed Seal, Home Team Coordinator said, "Meeting with the Lt. Governor was a great way to highlight Home Team's success while motivating us toward greater action going forward. We appreciate that Lt. Governor Crouch and State Representative Pressel took the time to learn more about our efforts to end homelessness in La Porte County."

Unity works hard to stay engaged with our legislators, so that we can share knowledge and progress on the important topics in our communities. Home Team, which consists of 30 agencies and many dedicated people, strives to prevent and eliminate homelessness through coordinated efforts.
